New Family at Sila Land

During heavy rainy season on the first week of August, Mr. & Mrs. Seth Hankham came across Na's family in a mushroom factory in Khon Kaen. Na, with his wife Ja and three children had been living in a small hut with no proper walls, doors or windows. The couple had been working for the mushroom factory for a long time. Early this year, Na had fallen from a tree and broken his neck, resulting in paralysis from his upper body down to his feet. With the head of the family unable to work, it had become a very great challenge this family to provide for their needs.

Our team visited the family to assess their situation. They were in a very difficult spot. Moved by God, Mrs. Jason and the team has decided to transfer them to Sila Land and let them stay in the Thai house there, which no one is using at that time. Now the family has proper accommodation. Mr. Na has been provided with medical equipment needed to train and strengthen his muscles. His wife Ja has joined our team as a staff member, and we are in the process of helping this family to be productive and hopeful despite of the challenges they face.







Mother's Day Celebration

Every 12th of August, Thailand celebrates "Mother's Day". Our team distributed gifts to the mothers in neighborhoods in Sila Land and in the Thepharak railway community. As our gesture of honor for their hard work in nurturing their families as best as they can, each mother we met received a box filled with goodies. Their smiles reflected their grateful hearts knowing that their role in society is greatly appreciated.



Disaster Relief in Northern Thailand

In late September, heavy rainfall caused a lot of damage, especially in the Northern part of Thailand. Flash floods and landslides affected many areas. Through Mrs. Thongbin Loboon, we have been able to send help to many who are in need in Chiang Rai and Phayao provinces. She has been coordinating with the churches in the said areas to help distribute mattresses and disaster relief goods. Though our staff has not been able to physically go to the affected areas, we are grateful for available people who have been volunteering to bring our help where it is needed and to shine sparks of hope to those whose dreams might have been washed away by the flood waters.
